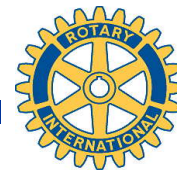

## ROTARY FOUNDATION

Foundation chair Bob Gough announced that November is **Rotary Foundation Month**. Consider becoming a Paul Harris Fellow and join the 39 fellows and 23 aspiring fellows in our club. Bob distributed a letter explaining that the club is working to create the Rotary Club of Gettysburg Benevolent Fund with ACCF. Please consider joining other Rotarians in contributing \$1,000 toward the \$10,000 minimum goal which must be raised by December 31 to establish this fund that would offer tax advantages under the IRS code. To give a vivid example of Rotary dollars at work, Bob introduced club member Brad Hoch.

Brad explained the sources and expenditures of the \$200,000 annual budget needed for his Medical Mission to Honduras. Trip participants pay about \$120,000-140,000 through airfare and project fees. Donations are the source of \$60,000-80,000. Our club has contributed \$4,000 annually. Half of the funds from donations are used for medicine. About 30% buys dental and oral surgery supplies. The remainder goes toward a feeding program, hospitalization and transportation. Brad explained how the feeding program solved the problem of patients fainting from hunger at the clinics and also helps local farmers.

Philanthropy chair Sharon Geleta inspired us with a story about Ted Turner's father's lifelong service to Rotary and announced two check recipients.



Vickie Corbett, board president of **Holiday Family Outreach** received a check for \$1,500. HFO served 475 families last year and distributed 1679 food certificates. Started in 1953, HFO

operates on a \$50,000 annual budget and functions solely with the help of volunteers. Vickie thanked the club for its support.

Our own Fred Guinn received a check for \$500 for the **Adams County Community Foundation's Widening Circles** campaign to increase awareness about its opportunities and benefits to the entire Adams County community. "For good, for Adams County, forever" is ACCF's slogan. Fred expressed his thanks for Rotary's support.
