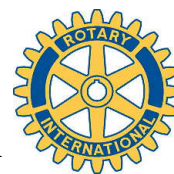

PROGRAM—

Cori Steimling spoke about her trip to Yellowstone and Grand Tetons Parks. She is last year's winner of the Charles & Elizabeth Smith Wilderness Venture Scholarship, and currently a 10th grader at Gettysburg High School.

While the trip was an outdoor adventure, it was geared towards developing leadership skills through team building.

The group of students from all over the country spent the first part of the trip in Grand Teton park, where they took kayaking and climbing lessons. They spent time kayaking on the Snake and Hoback Rivers, hiking, and climbing Teton Peak.

The next part of the trip was to Yellowstone National Park and they toured Old Faithful. The next day the group spent 4 days in the back country. While in the back country, they practiced no trace left behind camping, and saw a grizzly bear with her cub, moose, bison, elk, ospreys and bald eagles. After the camping trip they returned to Jackson Hole for a day of shopping and swimming, which was very welcome after washing in cold creek or lake water.

Cori learned much about leadership and team building on this trip and learned to have an open mind, listen to others input, and to contribute to the group. She found a couple of new mottos that summed up her experience: *Friends will be an encouragement to others, and leadership is an action, not a position.*
