PROGRAM

Dr. David Moore, Carey's son, provided the program. He detailed his cross country bicycle trip from California to Massachusetts with narration and photos from the trip. The purpose of the trip was to raise money for the Lance Armstrong foundation and because he has always desired to take on the challenge of a cross country bike ride.

The group that he rode with consisted of roughly 50 riders, 26 who actually rode the entire distance, and another 25 who rode different lengths and times periods. The group was accompanied by the America by Bicycle company who brought 2 vans and trailers for supplies, parts and support for the riders.

Dr. Moore covered 3912 miles in 47 days on his bike averaging 83 miles per day. On the route, they encountered several historic sites, such as the Golden Gate Bridge, Donner's Pass, Lake Tahoe, the Bonneville Salt Flats, the Continental Divide, President Eisenhower's Home Town, the Indianapolis Speedway, and the Erie Canal.

The group encountered all kinds of weather and terrain, had to fix up cuts and bruises from spills, repair their bikes, and repair what seemed to be countless flat tires.
